Green Signals Ahead

n the February/March Gazette, I mentioned that we need your help with a growing number of PLS "Projects". In just the past month we have added several new projects to the list. Below is a recap of those projects listed by name along with a thumbnail of the status. We have also added the Project Leaders names. Some of these Projects are what we considered new builds, meaning that it is new construction on the property. Some are needed maintenance projects that are required to keep the railroad running safely. Others are continuation of work that in some cases have been going on for years.

An example of a long term project is the improvement and expansions to the signal system. We will be adding signaling to a siding block on the one inch, 4 ¾ gauge siding on the north side of the railroad. A new dwarf single is needed to show occupancy of the siding. The reason for this improvement is simple. As you approach the signal and reach the pushbutton that selects the switch to the siding, the siding is not visible due to a grade change and curve in the track. Also the view is blocked by bushes that prevent the engineer from seeing whether the siding is occupied or not. The ground level dwarf would give the approaching engineer an indication that the block is occupied or not. This helps to keep a train from blocking the mainline and causing a traffic jam until the siding is clear or he or she has an opportunity to back up and reset the switch in order to continue on the main line.

What's involved with this signal improvement? A section of the siding track needs

the addition of rail insulators. The rail is cut and non-conductive plastic rail joiners along with an insulator that goes between the cut in the rail. Wiring is added to this section of the siding and that connects to a signal lamp card that will most likely be mounted in a box near the dwarf signal. Low voltage power will need to be run to the signal card from the closest power source - one of those small buildings you see near the track as you ride around the railroad. The wiring is buried in plastic pipe and usually in the ballast near the track. Since the siding already has an electric switch actuator, spare wire may already exist to power the new signal lamp card and the signal bulbs. When the dwarf signal head is placed next to the track a hole is dug and a small concrete post is placed in the ground with a pipe in the center that allows us to run the wires for the lamps (12 volt light bulbs). The project is not overly complicated, but as you can see by this description there are a number of steps that need to be taken over 4 to 8 Wednesday or Saturday work sessions in order to complete this project.

A Project like the "Porch Extension" is new construction. It is not overly difficult, but involves cylindrical footing holes to be dug for the roofs supporting posts and all the wood and metal roof work along with building the trusses to support the roof. The roof will cover a 20' x 30' concrete slab and the ground will need to be prepared for the new slab. Trimming and painting will round out the project. This is just a brief description of the work that we will undertake, but it should give you some idea of the scope of the project.

Here is our revised project list:

- 2. Porch Extension Status: Variance Approved, Completion: 0%, Skills: woodwork, Lead: F. Webb
- 3. PLS Main Bldg. Roof Repair Status: Not started, but urgent, Skills: woodwork, Lead: Paul Quirk
- Yard/Bldg. 3 Switch Status: Started, Completion: 95% Skills: many, Lead: Lee Nonnemacher
- Switch at Brown Box Status: Started, Completion 40% Skills: many, Lead: Ron Henderson
- Backhoe Lean-to Status: Not started, Skills: woodwork, Lead: TBA
- **Caboose Paint Restoration** Status: Not Started: Skills: paint rehab, Lead: Jim Salmons
- **East Rahns Project** Status: Not Started, Skills: surveying, track layout, Lead: Pat Murphy
- Foot Bridge Status: Not Started, Skills: woodwork/repair, Lead: TBA
- 10. Dwarf Signal 1" Siding North Status, Not Started, Skills: (see above), Lead: Ron Henderson

Without your support we cannot and will not make much in the way of progress on any of these Projects as we get ready for the New Year of running.
